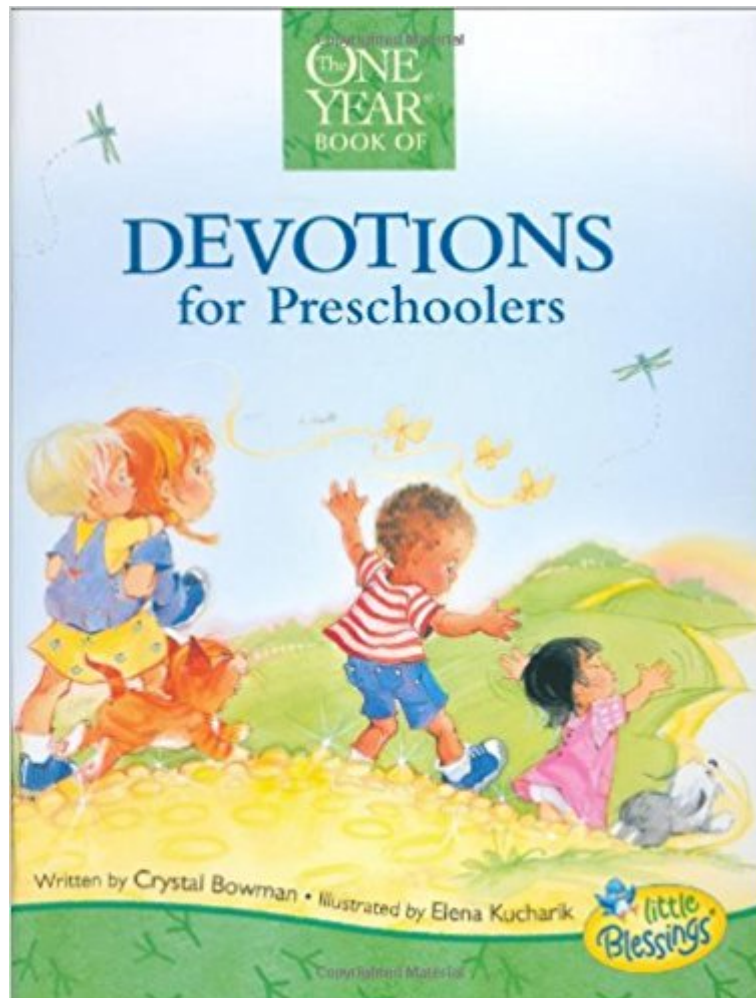

"The One Year Book of Devotions for Preschoolers" provides easy-to-understand devotions and beautiful art featuring Kaitlyn, Jack, Zoe, and Parker. Preschoolers will learn that they can talk with God about everything they do. Enjoy this newest book in the Little Blessings collection together!

This one's hit or miss. There are several devotions that are decent, but it's not consistent. If you're looking for a biblically based devotional for your preschooler, this is **not** it. You'll be skipping parts or altering what the author wrote because she occasionally espouses a works-based view of salvation. In other words, you need to do something for God to respond favorably towards you. This isn't the God of the Bible. If you're looking for a devotional that teaches you that you can save

yourself with good works - this is the one for you, but that is not Christianity - it's religion. The one thing that sets Christianity apart from *all* other religions is that Jesus did the ultimate righteous deed of dying on the cross for our sins so that we wouldn't have to "work" for salvation, as Crystal Bowman espouses at times. Ephesians 2:8,9- "For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not of your own doing; it is the gift of God, not the result of works, so that no one may boast." Cons:-Inconsistent theology throughout devotional-Espouses works-based theology which is unbiblical and unchristian-Encourages the view that you need to be good for God to help you or love you or be happy with you-"The more you read the Bible and pray, the more God will help you." - no God will help you if you call out to Him, period...not if you read your Bible more and pray more.-"But God doesn't want us to worry about riches. Being a good person is more important." -Being a good person is more important? Actually, having a relationship with God is *most* important. Being a good person isn't the goal. Knowing and loving God is the goal. Loving others is a natural outflow of knowing and loving God. Pros:-Nice pictures-Cute, rhyming prayers-Dated so you know where you left off

This book is about the sweetest toddler devotional ever. I find the reviews that say it's all "works based" confusing. Many of the devotions are how wonderful God is and how you can enjoy his presence in so many ways. Christianity is not based on your works....however....it should motivate you to be involved in Godly works.

These are a part of our nightly routine now, and I'm delighted by this book. It's short enough to keep my 3-year-old's interest. He loves to find the day. He knows the date better than I do, because he remembers last night's number. It is actually meant to read at the start of each day, but we're just planting seeds and trying to make some Bible study/reflection a habit.

We were searching for a devotional for our 2 1/2 year old and found this book. This is a wonderful

devotional for young children; the stories are simple and easy for a young child to relate to in everyday life and understand. Each story & concept is followed by simple questions to ask the child, a short prayer and a Bible verse. I would highly recommend this book as a wonderful teaching tool and as an introduction to making devotions a regular part of any toddler/preschooler's daily reading.

Some are a bit over their heads but I think the book is intended for more like 4-6 year olds so that is to be expected. I also view it more as a launching pad to talk about a certain subject as the text is not always super clear with the topic. The pictures are great. My older daughter has learned the names of the little characters and likes to tell me what is going on in the pictures before we even read the text. Overall a good product!update: Half way through the year and the girls still are enjoying doing these devotions each day. Even my younger daughter is involved and likes to talk about the characters in the stories. I'd still recommend this book!

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
