Britannia is left to fend for itself as the mighty Roman empire undergoes its lengthy collapse, and in the wake of imperial iron and law begins a new age of squabbling kings, ambitious warlords and

savage invaders. Meant for the cloth as the 3rd son of a king with imperial lineage, the wilful Uther is thrust into momentous destiny when his family is decimated by war in his absence. Fearsome in battle, indomitable in his unification intent, his deeds bring victory and brighter prospects for all Britons until Uther's intractable desires cast a bloodthirsty shadow on all he has achieved. Fast paced with a diverse and colorful cast and crisp dialogs, set at a time of epic change that would yield many a medieval legend, the story makes for a thoroughly enjoyable read and I look forward to the next book in the series.

Been a King Arthur fan for a long time. Always get a chuckle out of the "romance" of the Middle Ages, chivalry, plate arms and armor, knights jousting...baloney! If there was an "Arthur" somewhere, it was probably one or two hundred years after the Romans left. He might have been the son of one of the Roman-descended families left (or voluntarily stayed) behind. (Kipling wrote a poem/ballad about a Roman veteran asking to be left behind with his family instead of returning to Rome), This is more about Uther Pendragon, Arthur's father and from an offshoot of the Imperial Roman family that stayed behind. We have Merlin, of course, other characters, but this is around 500 - 600 AD, life was simple and brutal. Honor was variable, life cheap, agreements were sometimes "changed" without notice. Lots of plotting, combat, back-stabbing, the Britons beset on all sides, with Uther trying to form a united Britain to defend against the other ethnic groups that were raiding and trying to invade. Had a great time reading it. Would like to see the saga continued.

First of all, I should say that I like this author and his style of writing so that may sway to some degree my opinion of this book. Having said that, I truly feel that this was an excellent book telling the story of the days of Uther Pendragon, High King Of Britain and the father of Arthur, future King and leader of "Camelot" and The Knights of the Round Table. The last traces of the old Roman Empire have just begun to fade from memory, there are threats from the Raiders from the North(Vikings) and usurpers from the South and East. Uther, like his father before him, devotes his life trying to unite the petty English Kingdoms into one strong nation under one High King that can defeat these threats and secure a peaceful, secure and prosperous kingdom. If you enjoy these kinds of stories of kings and kingdoms, full of intrigue and treachery but also grand battles and noble men, you will really enjoy this book. And Merlin is also present influencing events and advising Kings. A very enjoyable read. I highly recommend it!
