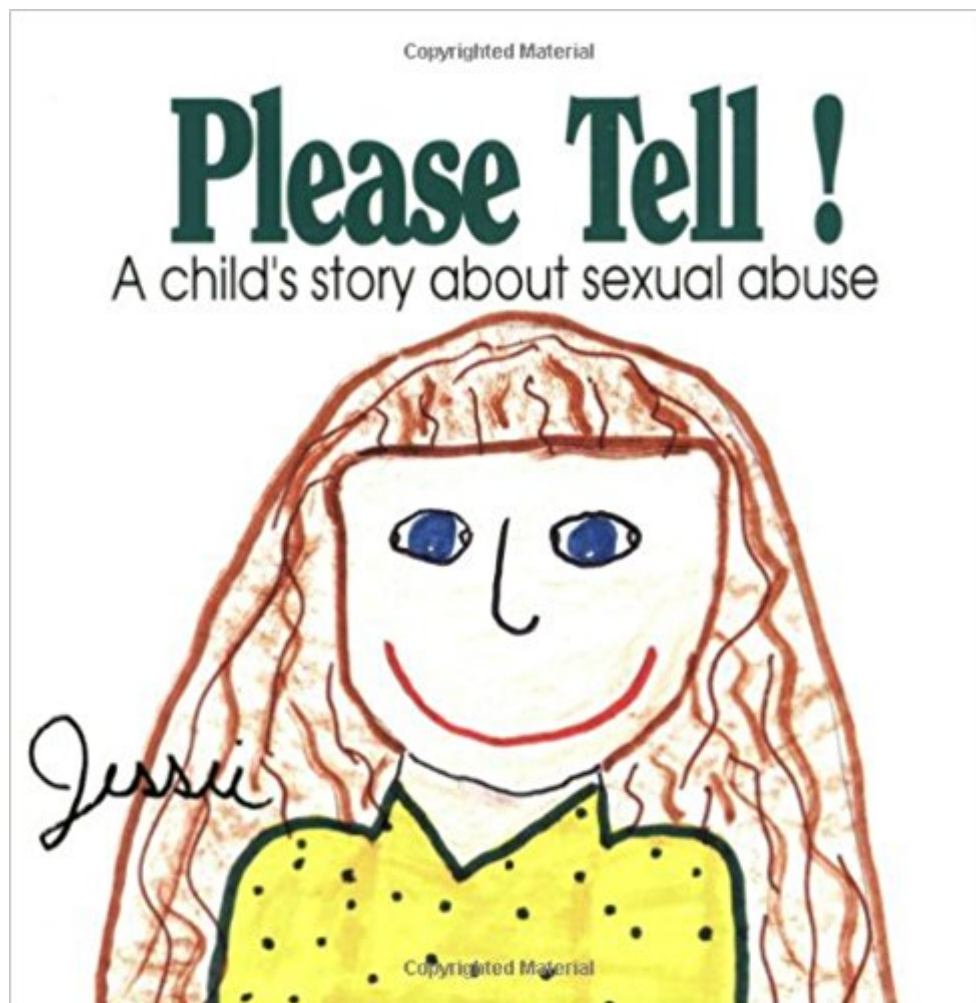




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# Please Tell: A Child's Story About Sexual Abuse (Early Steps)
