

I couldn't put the book down. The characters (Marcus and Calycia) came to life through the descriptive writing style favored by Haywood. A must read for fantasy lovers!

The Order allows us to see Haywood mature as a writer. The story unfolds in a way I havenÃƒÂ¢Ã ¬Ã ¢t really seen in other books. Instead of having the characters go on a long journey from location to location like most fantasy books, Haywood digs down on a small set of locations and continues to unfold more and more depth. By the time the story is over, I felt like I had to start over and try to pick up on early story indicators. IÃƒÂ¢Ã ¬Ã ¢ve already started re-reading this book, and I expect to re-read The Guardian and The Guardian Stone. Perfect prequel.

This is the third book I have read by Lee H. Haywood, and by far the best. I have enjoyed all of them, but this one transcended the fantasy genre and brilliantly explored the complex relationships that politics, love, power and bias engender. Within the first pages, the vivid descriptions of the environment and the conditions under which the characters found themselves were so compelling, I could not put the book down for wanting to know how they would fare. This book stands alone - one need not read the preceding two novels by this author to full appreciate its characters or its story line. I look forward to the next novel that Haywood publishes! (I got this one on Kindle unlimited - best book I read this month!)
