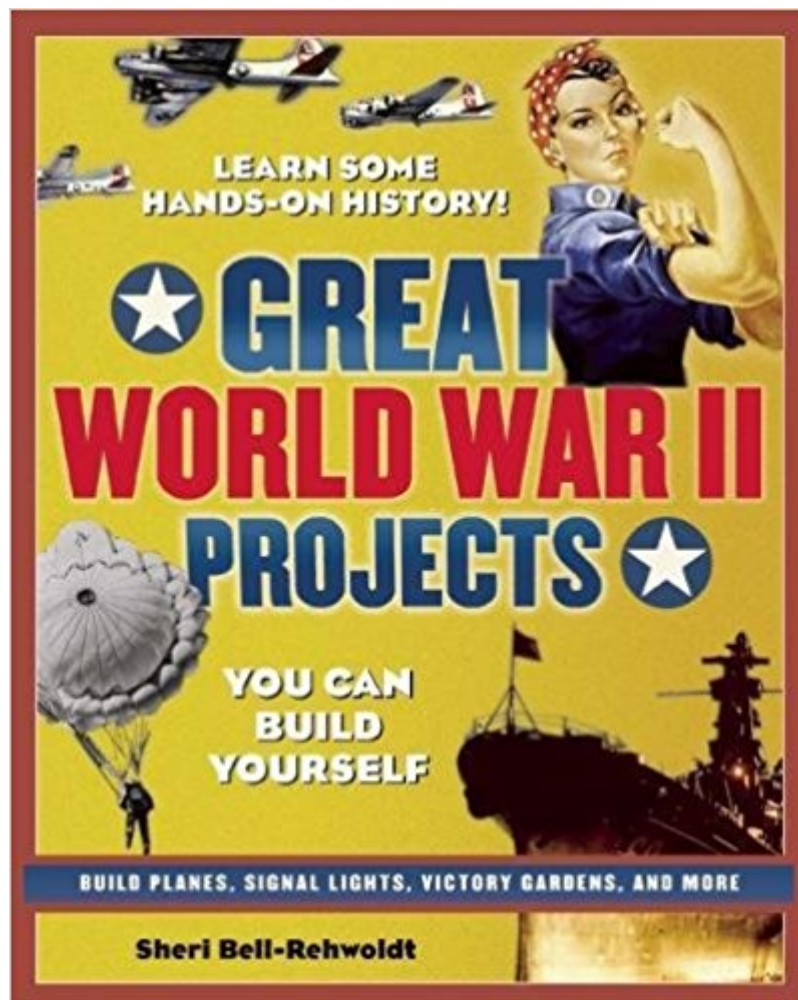

There are a few useful projects in this book----exactly three---that I can use for a one-week workshop with middle-schoolers. Most of the projects are not simple. They require lots of supplies/materials. The kids really cannot do the model airplane project independently because a sharp tool (like an exact-o knife, or very sharp scissors) are required. The narrative/text however, is VERY good. It is succinct yet includes a sufficient amount of info.

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
