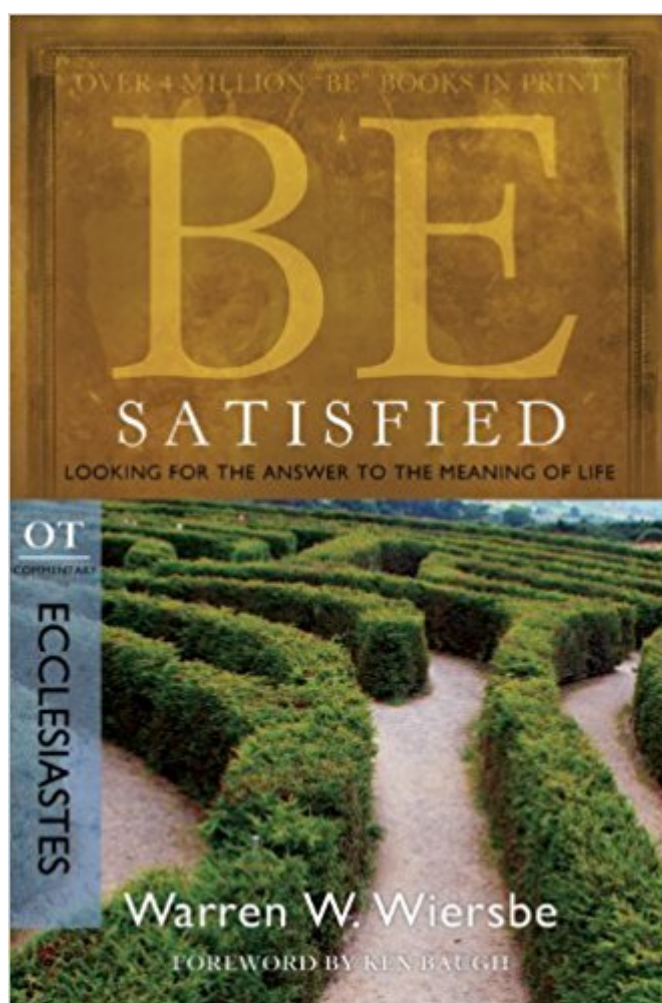

I can imagine it would be hard to write a book off of Ecclesiastes. A couple phrases kept being repeated throughout the book . I can't say it was the most fun to read, but it was interesting enough. I selfishly like to have a sense of completeness after reading a book and I didn't quite get that with this. It just kind of ended. Maybe I need to ponder more on it under the sun!

I am doing this on my own and just started, but I can tell it's going to be good. There are questions after each chapter. I have only done 2 chapters so far but I am learning much.

"Be Satisfied" is a commentary on Ecclesiastes. The author provided information about the book of Ecclesiastes (probable author, when written, etc.). Then he went through Ecclesiastes and expounded upon each group of verses. Much of what he said I've previously heard in sermons or I already understood just from reading the verses. He had some ideas that I hadn't heard before regarding a few of the less-clear verses. It was worth reading, but I didn't find it as useful as some of his other commentaries in this series.

This commentary is EXCELLENT and goes into A LOT of detail on the book of Ecclesiastes. There is only one reason I don't give it 5 stars. That reason is: In my Bible school we looked to understand each book of the Bible from the original readers perspective. What would Ecclesiastes have meant to the Israelite people who read these words from Solomon for the very first time. I don't remember too much of that coming out in this book. But Wiersbe's insight and detail on each verse of Ecclesiastes was very insightful and challenging. He really brings about where real satisfaction comes from. It was very beneficial in my study of Ecclesiastes. I do recommend this book!

It is rare to find such a well balanced explanation backed so completely on scripture. And it is written in such a simplistic, easy to understand way. It certainly makes it easy to apply these principles and teachings to present day life. A MUST READ even if you're not a biblical scholar.
