

I bought this book for my husband before he was to be stationed through the Army in Korea for a year. I bought this along with several other assorted travel guides, history books, historical novels, etc. My husband is not one to read much other than sci-fi novels, but out of all the books I got him, surprisingly he could not put this one down! He found it very interesting and, once in Korea, he has mentioned several times this book has helped him and co-workers avoid cultural blunders and better relate in day-to-day encounters outside of their camp. He has also repeatedly stated he finds the format easy to use and intends to look for Culture Shock guides to other regions we travel to.

This isn't just a tour guide that you use on vacation, though it would certainly come in handy for that. This book is filled with small details of daily life that will make everything so much easier to a western traveler. It is also incredibly creative and engaging, with history, politics, religions, even etiquette and is yet, never boring. I recommend this book to anyone who is interested in Korean culture, even if you have no plans on visiting the country any time soon.

I haven't finished the book completely yet, but thus far, it has provided great insights into the history and culture of Korea. Having studied abroad in China, I had a handle on the types of things I wanted to read about before I head to Korea for a job; this book has fulfilled that, providing information regarding everything from social cues, basic etiquette, living and working in Korea, culture, faith, etc. I really like that this book points out differences (even subtle ones) of which Westerners should be aware. If you are just generally interested, some of the practical information may be too much detail for you, but if you plan to travel to Korea or move there for work or study, this is a great book to get you started on understanding what might greet you there. :)
