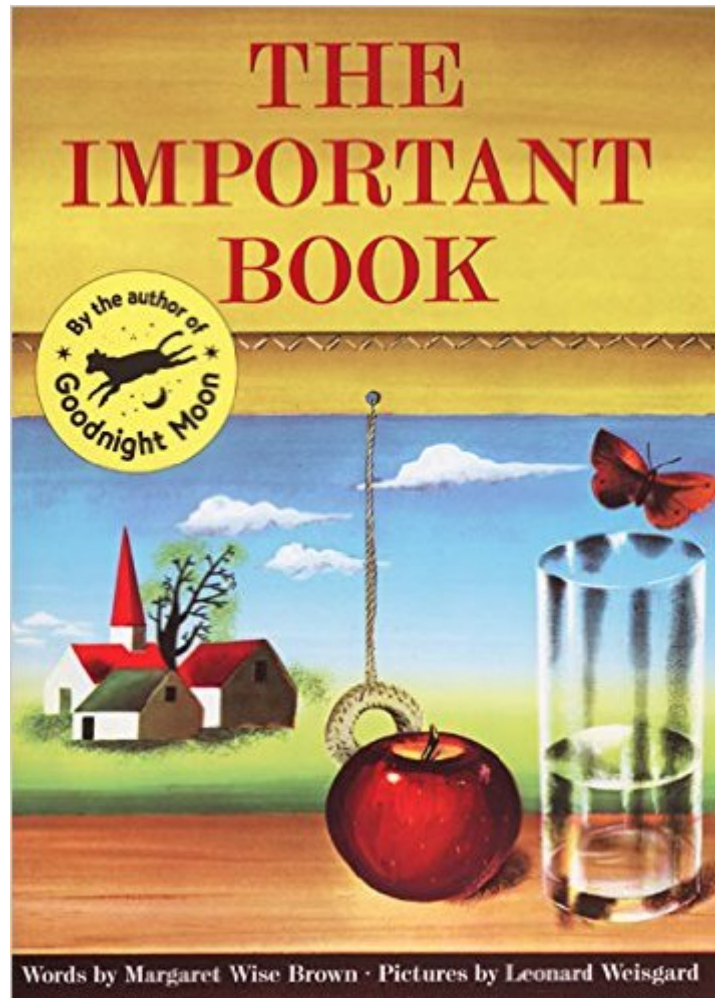




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The Important Book

This book helps curious preschoolers notice important details about their everyday surroundings, like daisies are white, rain is wet, and a spoon is used for eating. "The important thing about rain is/ that it is wet./ It falls out of the sky,/ and it sounds like rain,/ and makes things shiny,/ and it does not taste like anything,/ and is the color of air./ But the important

thing about rain is that it is wet." Goodnight Moon creator Margaret Wise Brown's *The Important Book* is a deceptively simple exercise--taking familiar things like an apple, spoon, or shoe, and finding the most basic association with those things. The most important thing about an apple? It is round. A spoon? You eat with it. A shoe? You put your foot in it. But why, according to Brown, is the most important thing about grass "that it is green," while the most important thing about an apple is "that it is round"? Why is "that it is white" the most important thing about snow and a daisy? Whether or not you'd distill these things in the same way that the author does, Brown makes us think about the essence of everyday entities in new ways. The illustrations, by Caldecott Medal winner Leonard Weisgard (*The Little Island*), perform the same function--capturing the spoonness of spoons, the roundness of an apple, the motion of wind. Happily, Brown went on to create the companion *Another Important Book*, about the importance of being one, two, three, four, five, and six years old--published for the first time in 1999 with fabulous artwork by Caldecott Honor artist Chris Raschka (*Yo! Yes?*). Both of Brown's "important books" will endure the test of time as fresh, thought-provoking ways to examine the world around us. (Click to see a sample spread. As a parent, I know "Goodnight Moon" by Margeret Wise Brown, from memory. I can recite it without looking at the pictures. As an Early Childhood Educator I see great value in "The Important Book" by Margeret Wise Brown. I recently attended a literacy workshop as part of my Early Childhood Professional Development, and this book came up in discusssion many times. I hadn't heard of it and couldn't wait to get a copy. I purchased it on , and I was not disappointed. This book evolves: The brightly colored pages captivate it's "readers." Non-readers will find many interesting details on the pages. Shared readings will allow a rhythmic simple text to allow shared discovery and

comforting repeated reading much like "Goodnight Moon." As a child grows and matures, and emerges as a reader this book's extra texts will offer many opportunities for comfortable but challenging growth with a safe subject matter.

The Important book is an excellent book to use to expose children to philosophical thought and concepts. Do things have an essential property? Children as young as Pre-K can begin to conceptualize everyday items, and what the most important quality of that item is. The book illustrates a number of common items such as spoons and apples, and tells the reader what makes them most important. That very concept of the author distinguishing what's important opens the door to a world of questioning, where young readers with the help of an adult, can begin to question what truly is the most important quality, if any, of an apple and many other items. In the end, this can allow children to become more critical consumers of information through philosophical reasoning.
