

I purchased this guide to take to Ireland in May 2016 and found it to be one of the least helpful guides ever. So much so that I left it half way through the trip and relied on a 9 year old Lonely Planet guide. We traveled from Dublin through Wexford (minimal information) to Cork, Kerry, Limerick, Clare, Galway, Donegal, into Derry in Northern Ireland, and finally Meath. After Dublin, it seemed that anytime I tried to look up nearby sites or attractions, there weren't any, other than the most major ones. No tidbits on things to see, nada! I'll only give it one star for the maps.

If you're young, plan to do a lot of pub crawling, and plan to rent a car to drive far from the beaten paths, this book may appeal to you. It seems to have an emphasis on bars and music in Ireland. Lots of people visit Ireland for that, but I'm planning a trip to see the history and natural splendor, so I was disappointed. Also has an abundance of driving directions; have to skim past that to get to the info/review about attractions. Not the guidebook I'll be carrying with me on my trip next year.

I added this book to a Rick Steves' guidebook and a lot of information from the internet. It has helped fill in some gaps, mainly because we are traveling to the north and west, sort of off the beaten touristy southwest routes that all the Ireland guide books seem to prefer to cover. This one covered more of County Donegal and Northern Ireland than the others I considered. The suggestions are good for everyday style traveling - self driving tours, staying in B&Bs, eating in pubs. Lots of reasonable suggestions for all those topics. It's been quite helpful. Horrors! We have ripped out the sections from the book that we will take on our trip. It pains me to destroy a book, but no need to carry the entire tome to Ireland.
