

•This book explores one animal pair per spread and features simple rhymes ("Octopus fat, octopus thin. Sea urchin out, sea urchin in"). A few of the comparisons are clunky (snow leopard climb, snow leopard fall), but most do an effective job of showing the differences. The last two spreads answer the question, "Where do all these creatures go?" and provide a simple illustration of their habitats. The text is accompanied by vivid, appealing acrylic drawings surrounded by textured borders, with backgrounds painted in thick strokes. An attractive, useful concept book.

With bright colors and eccentric illustrations, this board book is bound to captivate your little one, all the while teaching them a thing or two about opposites. The book's content is simple--as it should be--yet creative without being abstract. I should also say it's not OVERLY simplistic (as some books covering this subject matter tend to be a bit tedious for the parent to read as it just spouts off opposites without any context.) We've tried a few books about opposites in the past, and this is easily our favorite. I was happy with the selections they made for this book, and also I wasn't short-changed--there are plenty of pages to keep your little one entertained, without it being overbearing to flip through or time-consuming to read. The quality is fantastic. I can see this lasting a long time and being a favorite of my daughter's, who loves animals. We were so pleased with this title that we bought the other two in the collection--Counting Cockatoos and Alligator Alphabet. If you are contemplating between this book and another book on opposites, I would venture a guess that you would end up being happier with this one. We sure were.

This is a great book to read to toddlers. It really helps to expand their vocabulary while at the same time teaching them about opposites. I was first introduced to this book at a family get together and was amazed at how our 18 month old cousin was able to say and fill in all the words as her grandmother read her the story. I immediately knew we had to have this book for our own 18 month son. He loves this book! It is a great teaching tool.
