

In the introductory material you will find out what the Praxis Core Tests are, what they test for, how they are scored, how they are administered, and many other critical things you will want to know. Take for example if you live in Guam, Maine, New Mexico, Texas, or the Virgin Islands, you must list your educational institution as a score recipient. Things like scoring are important, but when will I learn about the results? Two to three weeks after testing you will be notified via email. Of course, as I mentioned, heading over to the actual Praxis site was a big help and an eye-opener. No book will take the place of an education you have already got under your belt, but I find reviewing what I have learned can be very helpful prior to a test.

There is a lot of material in here that helps with review as well as Sample Questions to test your skills. The Tables are very useful. The first table contains "Common Root Words." I can take a look at the root, the meaning, and then can see one or two examples. In the mathematics section I found the sidebars examples, entitled "Helpful Hint," to be quite useful. For example when distributing and factoring, the hint explains that "Operations with polynomials can always be checked by evaluating equivalent expressions for the same

value." A section first, followed by the concepts, number of questions, and time allotted for the test section.

5 hours is allotted in total for the combined test; 2 hours in total for each individual test if they are taken separately. Allotted time provides for tutorials and review of background information.

I am always up for taking in as much information as I can from a variety of materials. I would recommend purchasing as many study, prep, and practice guides as the budget will allow. You don't have to be on the cusp of graduating to start practicing and once you know you definitely want to teach,

The sidebars include those that ask "Did You Know," "Check Your Understanding," offer up an occasional "Quick Review," or "Helpful Hint." This is a really nice study guide to help prepare for the PRAXIS certification exam. It is written well- all the concepts are fully explained in language that the reader can utilize and understand- not too complex but not too simple. I feel that it really gets you a good grasp on things and gets you well prepared for the test. The only negative I have found this far is that I am a more visual learner, as I know others are as well. There are not as many pictures to supplement the text as I like - and those that are included are black and white. May not be a big concern of some people, but it would make it nicer to study from and help me remember the necessary information in the future. Overall however, I am happy with this study guide. I would recommend this to others.

It is an educator's book, not one that measures student's knowledge. There are two practice tests in the book and chapters on math, reading and writing skills.
