

The author is easy to read and holds my interest, however the family background in this story was not something I choose for my escape reading. Although I'm not a fan of the paranormal, it was not overdone & not bothersome. But the minute detail of chemotherapy along with specific chemo agents used and the emesis following the therapy is best left to the authors own journal or nursing texts. Thank you, no thank you. A definite turn off!

I so enjoyed Pratt's first book, *An Innocent Client*, that I have been buying one after the other. I've read five of Pratt's books in the last nine days and just bought number six in the Joe Dillard series. Pratt has great story telling capabilities and one never becomes bored. The characters are so well presented that they come to life right from the beginning. I love this author and will be sorry when I finish #8 in this series. I am hoping for many more.

Book Two of the Joe Dillard series is every bit as absorbing and well-written as Book One. In *Good Faith* finds Joe switching sides. Tired of the grind of representing guilty people, he secures a job in the prosecutor's office. But he quickly learns the grass is not always greener on the prosecutorial side of the fence. Now he has an incompetent boss and politics to pressure him to violate his conscience and the rules of professional responsibility. Faced with a series of horrifying murders, Joe tracks the killers to a Satanic cult of three, two impressionable teenage boys and a young woman who embodies evil. Joe's sidekick in Book Two is Sheriff Leon Bates whose undying loyalty Joe earns when Joe stands up for the sheriff against the cantankerous Judge Ivan Glass. Together, they set off down a winding road of twists and turns to bring the Satanic killers to justice. Scott Pratt's books are full of page-turning suspense, but he also touches on deeper themes. Here Joe's life-long lack of faith is challenged by a curse the leader of the cult attempts to place on him. As members of his family become sick or injured one by one, Joe asks if this is the work of a curse that he doesn't believe in. He reexamines his long-held belief that there is no supreme being. He decides that if an evil exists which is strong enough to bring about the murder of innocent children, it is overcome by a counter force of good, which he seeks to represent, and which overrides that evil. I highly recommend *In Good Faith* for its authenticity, its well constructed plot, and its engaging and three dimensional characters.

Joe Dillard is a good man in a bad world. This story will keep you up all night reading or you will

rush through your day to get back to the book to see what happens next. There really is no point to stop reading!! Joe may have grew up without much love, but he grew up tough and sure of himself. This story is extra suspenseful due the the extent of evil in people that is revealed.

After reading Innocent Client, the 1st book in the Joe Dillard Series, I couldn't wait to read In Good Faith. Very good book, I could not put it down, BUT some of it was hard for me to read. I didn't care much for the satan stuff, kind of creepy, but it was a quick read and I did enjoy the book. There was just a hint of sexual content, not bad at all. I read a review about Scott Pratt before I read any of his books. He was compared to John Grisham, who I love, so I thought I would try Scott Pratt. Just a few chapters into Innocent Client I knew Mr. Pratt was my new favorite author. Just now starting on Book 3 of the Joe Dillard Series and I believe this will be just as good as the last two.

I loved that there were multiple storylines working. This keeps the reader engaged and thinking and wondering what is right around the corner. The Joe Dillard character is relatable and believable. He holds himself to a higher level of integrity while he is presented in situations where the reader is exposed to the human qualities that factor into very intelligent storylines. I've read two from the series and just bought the third. I am a huge fan of the Jack Reacher series of books and have found this author to be equally compelling. These opinions are my own and I was not paid to write them. I hope you find this of value and will read them, too.

Very disappointing as I enjoyed his first book of this series, I also enjoyed discovering "Joe Dillard" who I felt came alive as a real person, enjoyed his family descriptions and close bonds. I certainly did not enjoy the subject matter, very violent and scary. I as a rule love reading courtroom dramas and the toing and froing between the different lawyers and legal eagles. I have purchased the third book of this series and am looking forward to reading further about "Joe Dillard.", the dialogue is great..

This 2nd book in the Joe Dillard series is just as fascinating, suspenseful and wonderfully told as the first book. Scott Pratt takes interesting characters and various story lines and skillfully weaves the plot progression into an addictive, page turning, can't put the book down experience.
