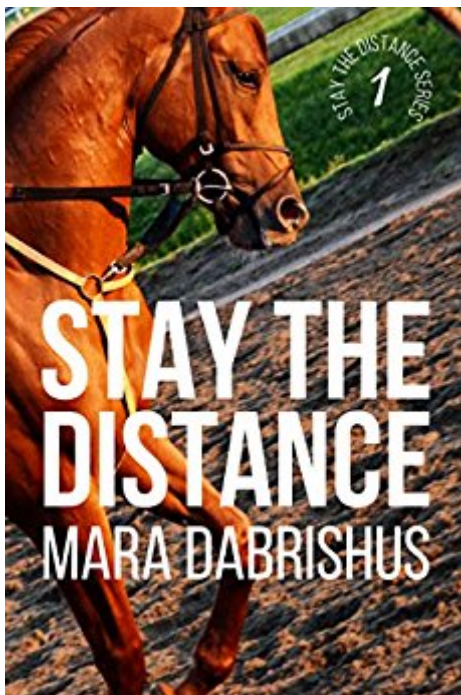


The book was found

Ok, it's not like I'm ancient, but as someone solidly into my twenties, I have been out of the "young adult" target audience for more than a decade now. Nevertheless, I loved reading this novel even as an "old adult," and when I look back on the kinds of books I loved when I was a young adult, I know

this would have fit right in among my favorites. This book would have fallen easily into my constant rotation of horse books, surrogates for the horse I didn't have but also beloved for the characters, the drama, and the rush of the racing scenes. July Carter is a young woman just finishing high school with no major goals beyond riding the Thoroughbred horses she has come to love in the Blackbridge race barn and tracking down her mother, who abandoned her family in single-minded pursuit of success as a jockey. Told from July's first-person perspective, we get a well-rounded picture of July's life and cast of side characters, including the rest of her family and the frustratingly handsome barn owner's son. While July is mature and self-reflective in her narrative, she also is impulsive and prone to obsession just like her mother, a parallel I enjoyed following throughout the story. This is a character whose head I actually enjoyed being in, always intrigued to see how her path changes course during an eventful summer at Saratoga. That barn owner's son is a thoroughly-enjoyable romantic foil. In the grand tradition of witty banter, will-they-or-won't-they, Beck and July have tangible chemistry that encourages the reader to flip the pages faster to find out if a summer romance will figure in to their dramatic summer. Beck, like July, is also young and impulsive, making mistakes and trying to do the right thing, and definitely had me rooting for him not long after his introduction. And of course the horse and racing details and descriptions are spot-on. The author clearly knows about horses and works the details into the characters' storyline well so that they flesh out the story and the plot, never exhausting the reader in minutiae. Overall, this was a fun read that I know I will turn to again. I would highly recommend this novel for fans of horse books but also just as a very good and entertaining story about an independent young woman.

A sweet, delicate coming-of-age romance set in the world of horse racing. The heroine July loves the world of the track—it is her family's trade and she has never wanted to do anything other than to ride. However, she has mixed feelings about the fact that her mother, a professional jockey, has abandoned the family to pursue her career. July is still exploring what it means to be a woman in a very masculine world and also must survive the tension of growing up surrounded by people like her sister and best friend who don't understand why horses are so important to her. The scenes describing what it is like to gallop a racehorse and the extent to which so many hopes and dreams are pinned to these beautiful but ultimately very fragile creatures make *Staying the Distance* both poignant and very much NOT your typical YA fiction. A great read for someone looking for a YA novel that's not just about boys (although there is a boy in the book)!

A fun read for horse racing fans, who get few opportunities to read quality fiction that is entertaining while still authentic and accurate. The author knows racing and riding and her acumen shines through in this coming of age adventure that can hold the interest and be enjoyed by adults who are perhaps not so young. July Carter, a diligent, feisty and troubled exercise rider for her trainer father, is juggling the responsibility of preparing some top horses for major races, the void of her long absent mother and a really awkward budding romance with the son of her father's boss. Her relationships with the horses under her care are equally problematic and seem to propel her toward resolution of her issues with humans. The reader anticipates the likely ending by the middle of the book, but it is okay as the author does a good job of making it fun and interesting regardless. Overall, this is a fun read and I would definitely read a full length sequel.
