


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Modern Architecture Since 1900

This book is just packed with information. But it is fun to read. Really an amazing bargain. I am trained as an historian and I am fascinated by architecture, but hadn't really done much reading on the subject aside from the architecture chapters in Jansen. I am finding this book to be a detailed and thorough treatment of the architecture of the past 125 years and I now have a much better appreciation for the term "Modern" as it applies to art and architecture. It is also a great review of the social history of the 20th century. This book not only describes and explains the development of architecture since the turn of the last century, it also explains how those developments arise from, shape, and respond to changes in culture and society. In my adult life I have experienced homes and offices that made me happy, sad, energized, depressed, comfortable, anxious, restless, and content. Reading this book, I am beginning to have a much better understanding of how design, both good and bad, affects our well being. No question, this is tough, academic reading. By the time I had read the prefaces and introduction I went out and bought a fresh blank journal so I could record notes to make sense of it all. The first four chapters have kept me up late for the past 3 weekends. I am taking notes, making sketches, and tracking down photos and drawings of the buildings described in the book. If I was 40 years younger, I'd be in the process of changing my major right now! As I write this, I am calling it quits for tonight, but I am eagerly looking forward to the coming chapter on the Arts and Crafts movement.

This book is incredible. It is the most definitive statement on Modern Architecture out there. It seeks to provide a comprehensive overview of modernist construction and aesthetic without oversimplifying or categorizing the work of individual artist/architects and specific locales into sweeping, generalizable trends. It fully succeeds. Curtis is balanced and nuanced in his critical analysis of the buildings presented. His dense prose is intelligent and insightful. The photographs are beautifully composed and complement the text. I highly recommend this book.
